Oftmals wechselt er den Ort, das Geschehen und die Personen und gestaltet somit eine farbige Welt, die in sich schlssig ist.Seine ganz groe Strke ist aber sein schwarze Humor und die Ironie, welche nicht zu hufig, aber gezielt und passend zum Einsatz kommt.
