I'm not much of a fan of paranormal stories, see, I could do with a smaller amount of mystery talismans and strange creatures but I got sucked into the Whyborne Griffin novels because of the extraordinary storytelling, and because of those two men I've come to love so very much. And because of Christine, adventuress and friend extraordinaire. So I got a little, well, enervated of all the keto and creature drama but that little twist at the end? The explanation of just why Whyborne is so very different? Man that blew me away and it yanked me right back on track. The character development, however, is something else. The shy bookworm sure has come a long way, and the dashing ex Pinkerton detective is no longer mere eye candy. Neither is Christine the token lady friend to a pair of confirmed bachelors. Whyborne will never be a smooth socializer but he's no longer afraid of his own shadow, and Griffin no longer thinks he needs to be larger than life all the time. The relationship moves on as well there's love, yes, but for the first time, there's also secrets and unease and disagreements, and while I never truly doubted the boys, I was nervous here and there.
