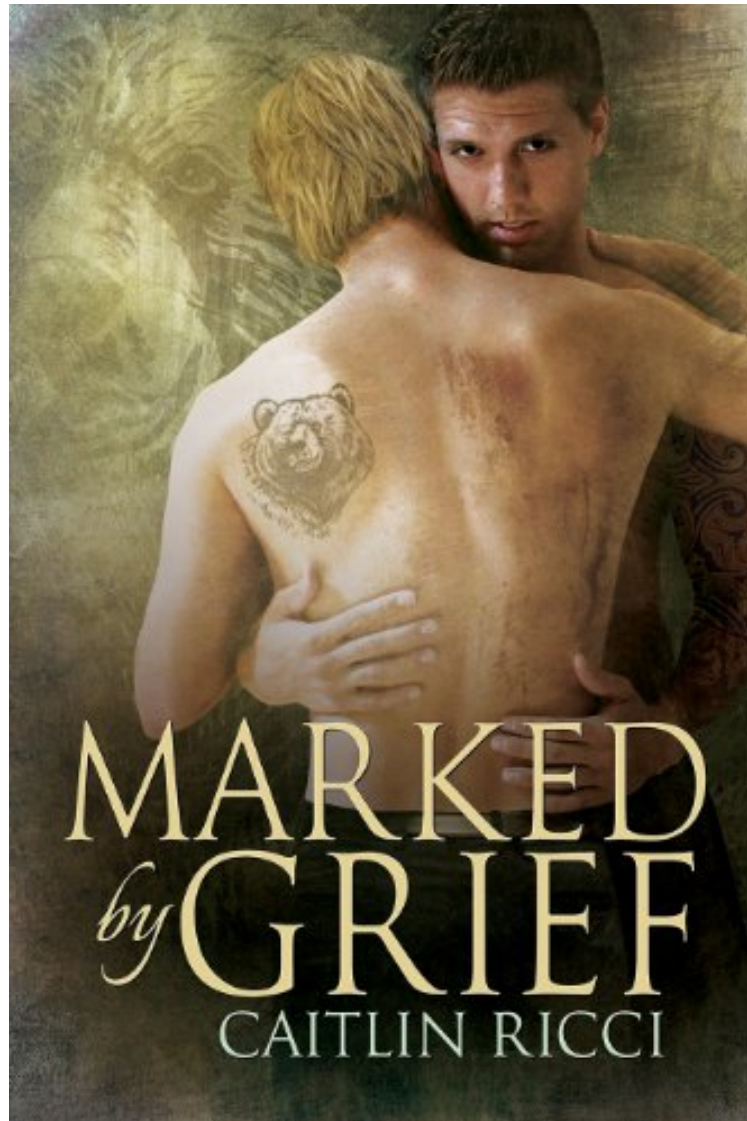

He doesn't eat, can't sleep without nightmares and stops going to college and to work. His father drains his grief in work and his mother doesn't know what to do so she lets him be. Jason, the best friend of his dead brother and the man he loves since forever, gives him

space not knowing that space isn't what Kit needs. It's a nice story where the parents aren't perfect and two young men try to fix their problems on their own. Although Jason is much more mature than Kit he often seems lost himself. But trying his best he forces Kit to life. And their love may heal their wounds...Kit is a wonderful character, lost in his grief and loosing the help of his parents he finds himself alone with the guilt and his pain. Once he confronts the past he finds himself overwhelmed over and over again, talking for the first time is painful but the tears are cleansing. He is strong albeit lost on his own but able to regain life with a little help from Jason. Kit's parents don't help him or themselves, they try to continue and hope that banishing the memories of their lost son might help their grief. They don't know how to help their remaining son, so they stop. Not right and not nice but understandable that loosing their son destroys the family. I liked the story although normally I hate stories where the Dom is a victim of child abuse and seems to hate himself for needing BDSM. Jason tells Kit that living kink is perfectly normal, while he himself isn't sure if he is able to have "normal" sex after the abuse. But his insecurities vanish the moment he is together with Kit, so they are acceptable. But I can't give more points to a story where SM is described as abnormal and the consequence of child abuse. There are lots of questions in the end and the story seems like the beginning of Jason's and Kit's time together. As beginning of their story it's really good, as one-shot it's a little shallow.
