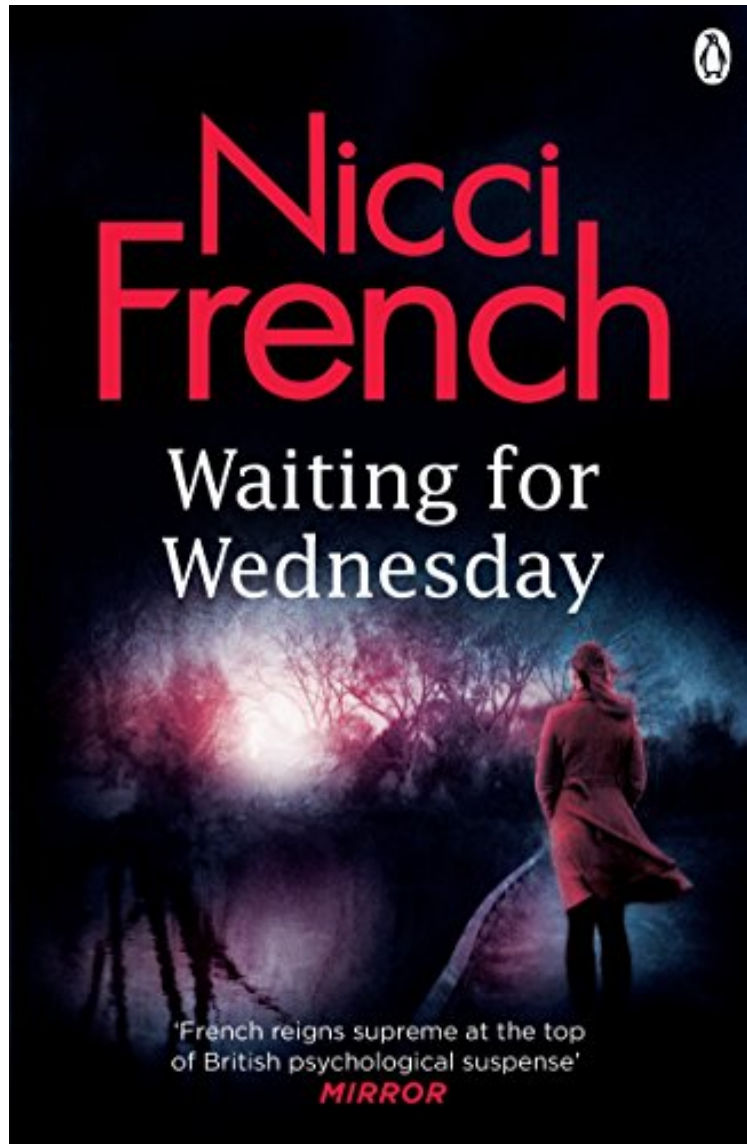

By now I knew that Frieda Klein is a Good-mensch. further down the line it took me ages to disentangle the various characters of all the stories within the story..and if you havn't read the previous issues then you are quite lost, anyway. Too many incidents, too many sleepless nights for the heroine, plus keeping a lover at bay, of course you're bound to become a nervous wreck! Poor Frieda! Von Lea Until about halfway through the book, I found it very compelling and definitely the best one of the Frieda Klein series so far. But then the story got more and more tiresome and less and less worth the effort. Threads that were presented as key to the book get completely lost and are more or less pointless (at least to this volume) - the Dan Reeds thread namely. The figure of Frieda becomes more and more irritating and hard to believe it - what psychotherapist on the surface of the earth would POSSIBLY get herself into such a relational mess (have the children of a murdered wife in whose case she herself is involved staying over at her place for example)? Plus one really wonder whether it serves the story well to put ALL theoretically possible disasters on one and the same family (double adultery, two murders, a horrible aunt etc.)..... In short: by the time I was through the novel I kind of felt I'd have enough of Frieda Klein and might just not bother about the following volumes. It's a shame because the authors obviously know how to write a novel - if only they didn't overdo it!! I'd give two and half stars if I could - more is too many, less is not quite fair.
