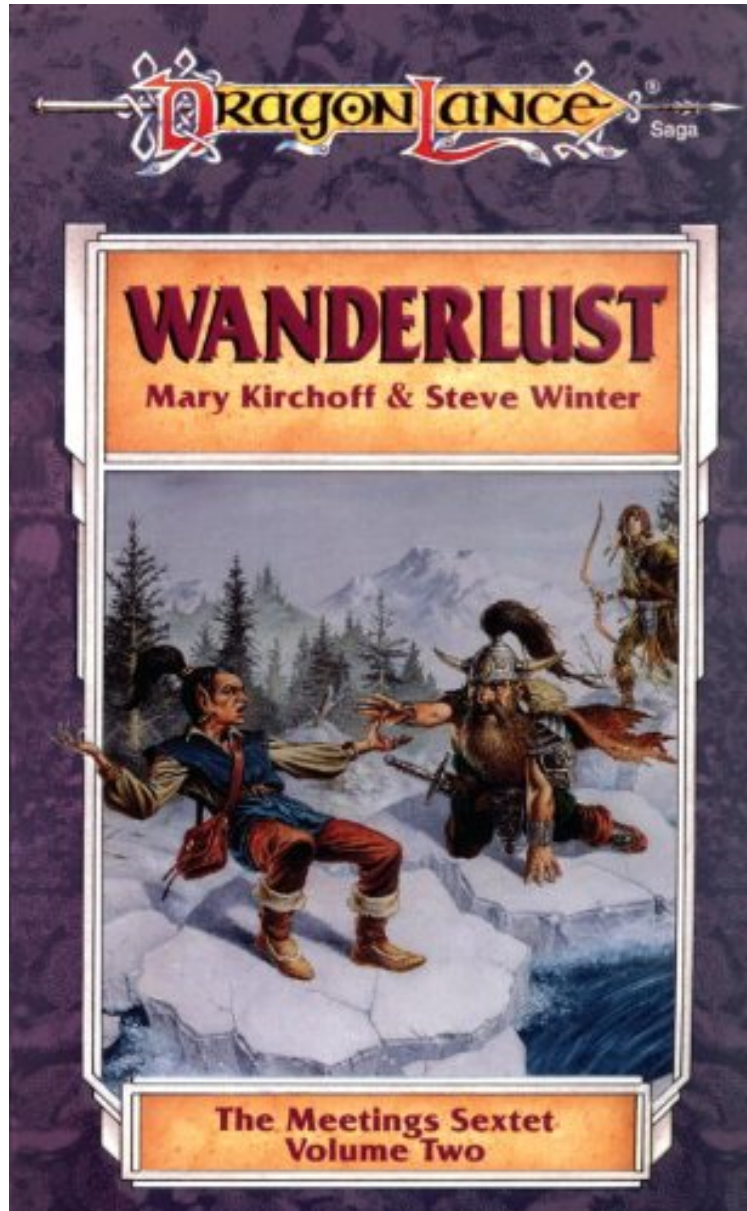

Das interessanteste an diesem Roman ist noch die Erzähltechnik, denn die Handlung wird aus ungewöhnlich vielen Perspektiven geschildert. Selbst Nebenfiguren bekommen eigene Kapitel, in denen sie im Mittelpunkt stehen, während die Protagonisten nur am Rand auftauchen. Das hilft jedoch kaum, die beim Lesen der Geschichte entstehende Langeweile zu bekämpfen, denn es mangelt hier einfach an Spannung und Humor. Der angeblich so mächtige Widersacher begeht eine Nachlässigkeit nach der anderen, sodass ihm schon allein deswegen am Ende Recht geschieht. Fazit: Nur für Fans von Tanis, Flint und Tolpan interessant, oder für solche, die jedes DL-Buch mal gelesen haben wollen.
