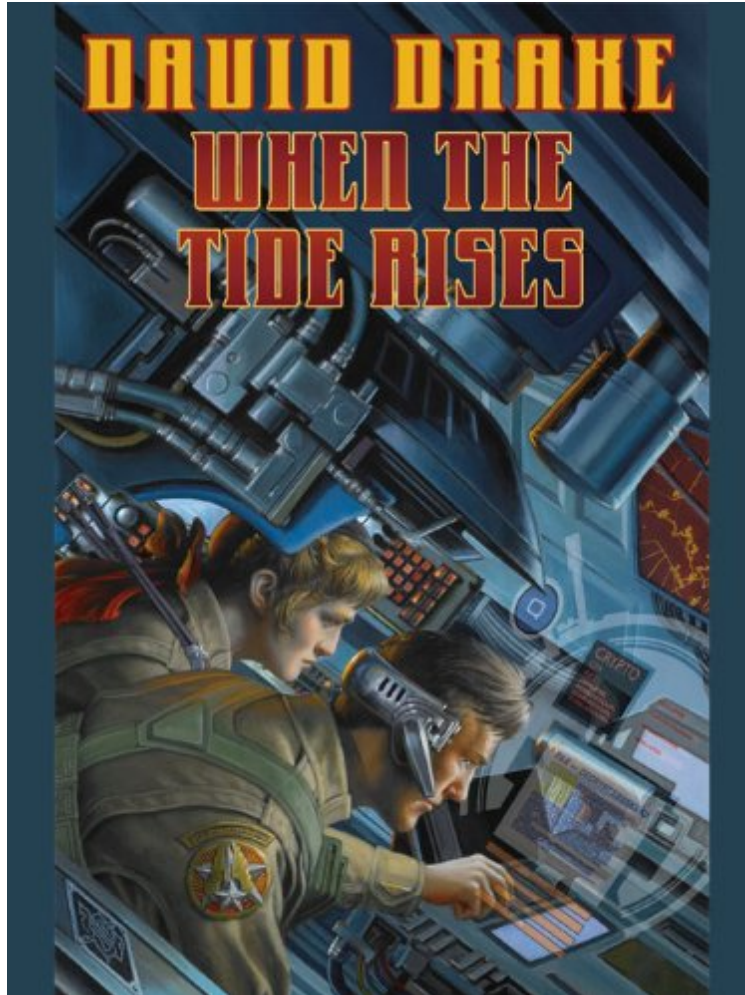

At home, he is still at odds with the ruling Director of the Navy Board of Cinnabar, Admiral Vocaine.Now, while I really like Drakes books and also his Lt. Leary series I finally grow a bit tired on the characters here.The Characters:Daniel Leary is still written as some happy-go-lucky, carefree teenager, indulging in easy girls on every harbor. Almost no character development can be seen, he is still the same as in book 1. And that seems pretty much unrealistic after all the war and bloodshed.

At least some seriousness should be shown. And no, dating Miranda doesn't qualify. Marrying her, may. It simply grows stale if the hero just keeps fooling around book after book, year after year. The same cannot be said of Adele Mundy. Here, we have a character development. But a totally strange one. At the beginning she is the bookworm, deadly due to her pistol training, but still mostly harmless. Over the books she is written more and more as a complete maniac though whose only thoughts are about either getting some information out of a system or about shooting someone in the face. Most her thoughts turn about killing someone for some imagined slight. Like in chpt. 10 where she thinks about shooting the captain of one of the ships because he isn't of one opinion with Daniel right away. And that pretty much sums it up about her. You're not of her opinion, she kills you. You ask her about something, she takes it as an insult and has to control herself. That's really a very flat characterization of an originally very interesting character. Rather than making her more interesting by broadening her view, she keeps on narrowing it, reducing her to a loose cannon, waiting to blow up. The texts about Tovera, Adele's servant, are completely interchangeable and probably are copied from one book to the next, to save write time and produce some lines. Yes, she is the super killer. The poisonous insect. The cold reptile. Thanks, I got the message. A totally uninteresting character, but for "Some golden harbor" where she appears to actually make around with a lizard man bodyguard. That put some color on an otherwise totally bleak, flat figure. Same counts for Hogg, whose always looking out for Daniel as a nice little puppy servant with a killing streak. He really doesn't fit together in my eyes. On the one side, he spent his life educating and caring for Daniel, on the other side he seems to have led a life in crime, enabling him to function in any lowlife surrounding and still more he seems to have led a life in the outdoors, making him the survivalist guy of the posse. Any one of the three would have been plenty for one life. But it doesn't fit in for a house retainer looking out for the boy of a highest rank nobleman. Other characters are mostly side figures, drawn very much stereotype. Although I didn't get the way Woetjans, Daniel's bosun, reacts when they are cheered on the street. I mean she actually tells her Captain that she is about to pummel civilians, including mother with their toddlers. There is no active western navy where such behaviour is tolerated. And the RCN is described as a mixture of English spoken navies. -----I would wish for future releases, that the characters get some more depth and a nicer attitude. If I want to read about maniacal serial killers there's a lot of other literature to be had. And this series really doesn't promote itself as murderer-horror stories. The action: This is where the book makes up. As Drake expands his RCN/Lt. Leary universe he gets better at writing the space battles, tactical and strategic decisions. Not a David Weber yet, but getting there. It's always fun to read how Daniel always finds the hole in the wall to squiggle through so as to still win in the face of impossible odds.
