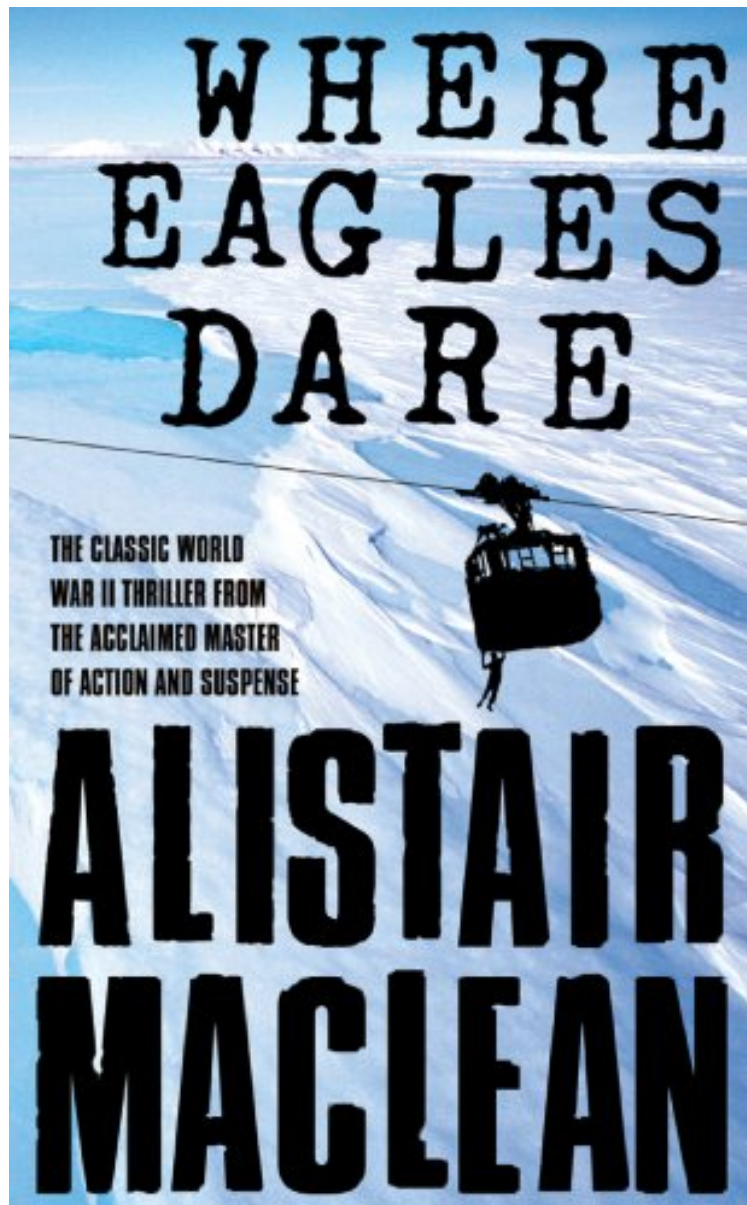

found this book just too farfetched. The Allied agents wander around Gestapo headquarters barely running into any Germans, even though the Germans know they are in the area. Those they happen to bump into come one at a time and are easily subdued, and tied up in too convenient hiding places. Could you imagine Russian spys wandering around CIA headquarters or US spies strolling down the hallways of KGB headquarters without being seen or noticed. The good points of the book are a plot that keeps you guessing on exactly what is going on. But I guess I expect better from MacLean. As for the previous complaint that Helicopters did not exist in WWII, the Germans developed the FW 61 Helicopter in 1937, which in 1938 maintained an altitude of 11,000 for 1 hour and 20 minutes.
