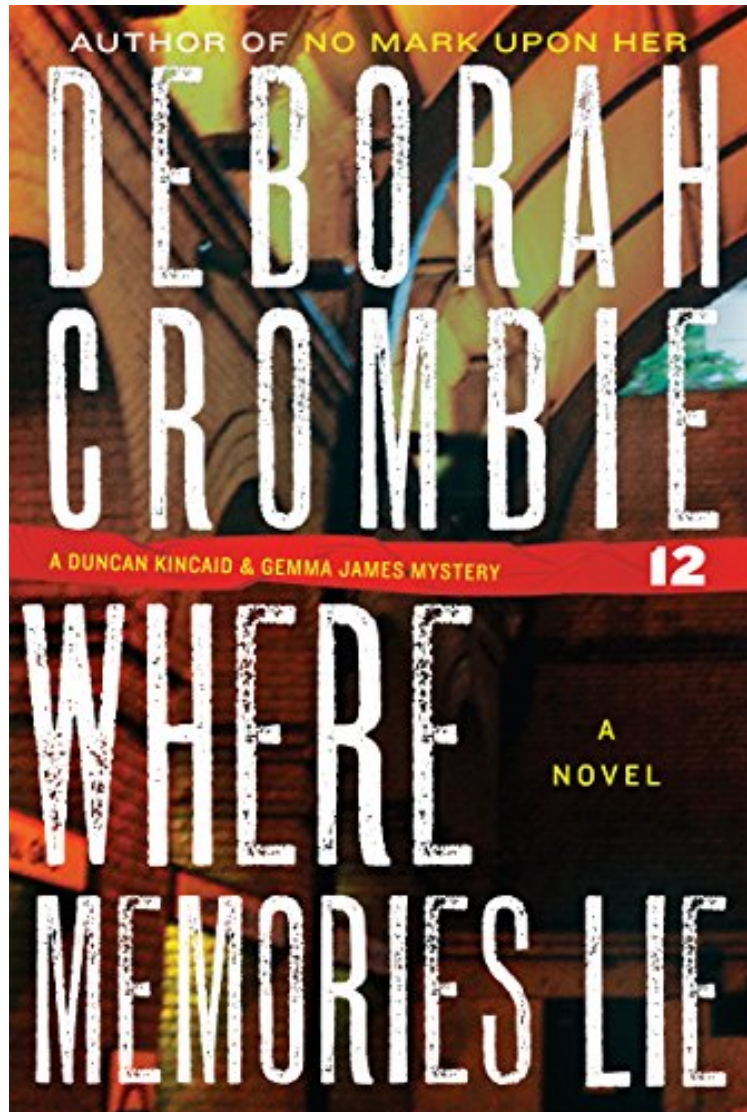

The plot is thrilling till the end and it was a real page-turner. Deborah Crombie has picked a topic, that is still relevant, even 65 years after World War II. And she has done a great job in getting all the historical details correct! Gemma's friend, Erika Rosenthal, managed to fled the Nazis together with her late husband David. Suddenly after all those years a family heirloom, stolen during their escape, shows up in an auction. Where has it been all those years and more important who has had it?
