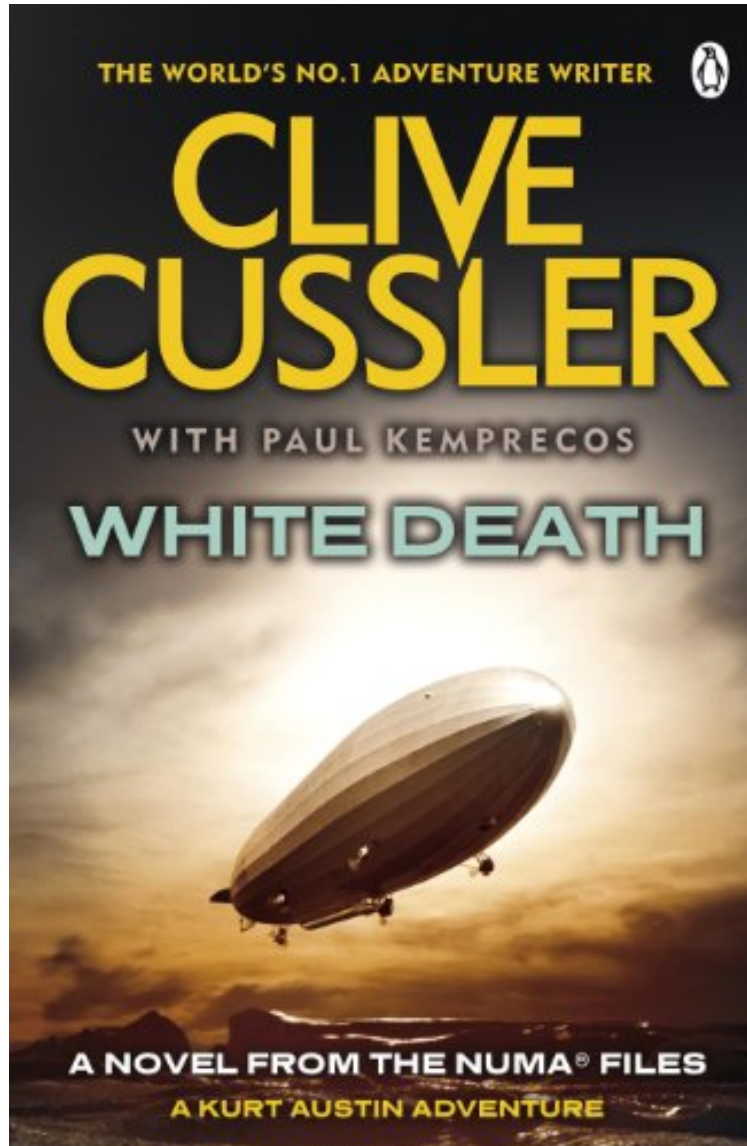

Following the mandatory teaser from the past - which, as always, involves some lost treasure - we are transported to the present and faced with a perplexing mystery. Why have prize fishing grounds in the North Atlantic been drying up? Austin and Zapata plod their way through secret caves, tired wisecracking dialogs, and the usual (not) perilous situations in an unexciting chain of events. All in all, this book was a major disappointment.
