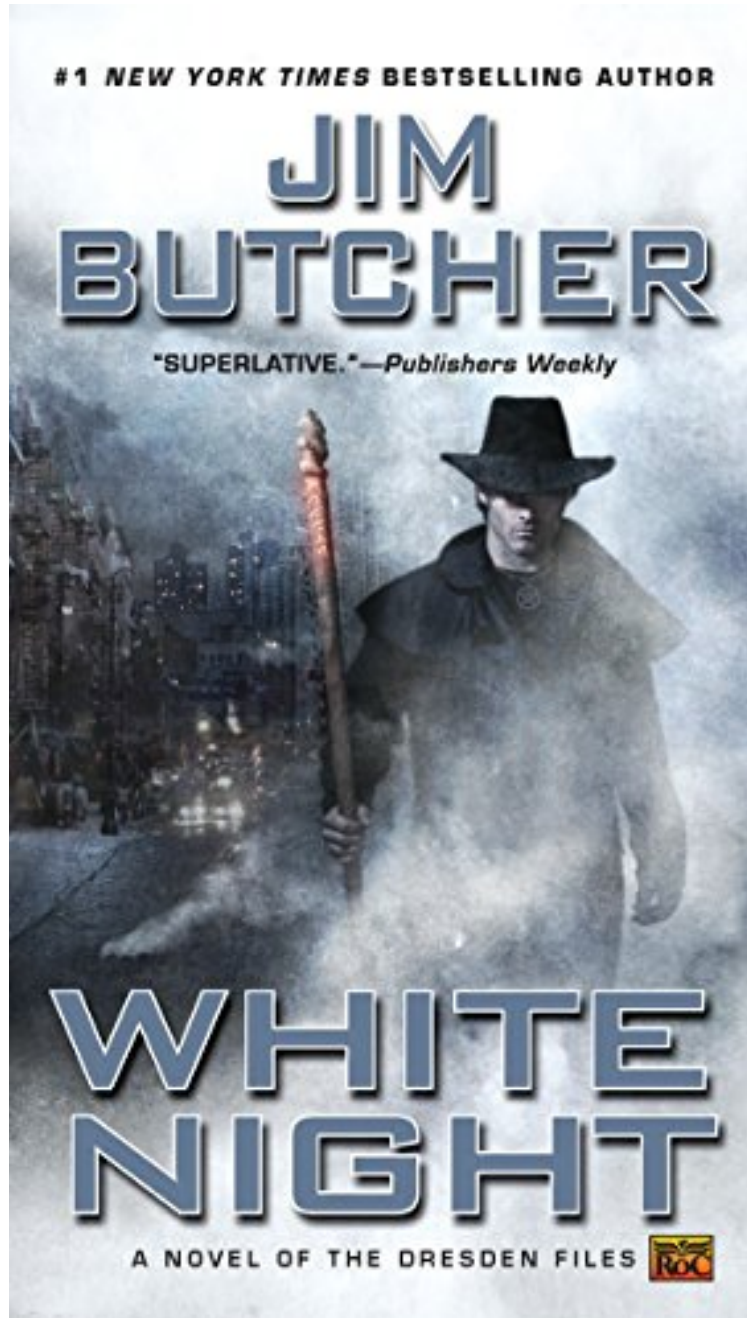

Nie war ein Held so menschlich, so symphatisch, so unverschmt im Angesicht von Dmonen und schmerzhaft plazierten Fusten. Immer mit einer sarkastischen Bemerkung oder einem Filmzitat auf den Lippen, trotz Harry Monstern und Glubigern gleichermaen, entzieht sich Gefahren, nur um im Angesicht des Wimpernklimperns einer Frau heldenhaft in die nchstbeste Falle zu springen. In White Night findet Harry durch die Hinweise Murphys heraus, dass der Anteil magisch begabter Personen in seiner Stadt durch angebliche Selbstmorde drastisch reduziert wurde. Und nicht nur in seiner Stadt. Noch immer den Versuchungen Lasciels ausgesetzt und mit der Gewissheit, dass Thomas - und der gesamte weie Hof der Vampire - in die Sache verwickelt ist, macht Harry sich auf das Bse zu vernichten und krftig in ein paar bernatrliche Gese zu treten. Leider haben die Besitzer selbiger Gese etwas dagegen und so entwickelt sich ein weiterer spannungs- und actiongeladener Showdown, der an Tempo, Witz und Gore kaum zu bertreffen ist. That said I have noticed that there is a fair bit of repetition in the books if you read large parts of the series back to back. The description of Mac's Bar appears in every book in much the same language and with no new information imparted, some of the dialog from the characters is similarly repetitive. All Im gonna say is "Hells Bells"...I felt the need to point out some of these failings because I really love the characters, and even though Harry's underdog anti-authoritarian diatribe becomes predictable its comfortable in its pique. I have all the books now from 1-16 and I still look forward to finding out whats in store for each of them as the series, hopefully, continues to develop.

Joined by his police friend, Sergeant Murphy, and his ian apprentice, Molly Carpenter, Harry discovers that his brother, Thomas, is a prime suspect. As a Warden of the White Council, at war with both the Red Court of blood-drinking vampires and the White Court of psychic vampires, Harry has to go into action. And there's plenty of that, including a battle with ghouls on the lakefront that turns into a gripping flashback of another encounter with ghouls some years before in New Mexico. The large cast features such finely drawn characters as gangster Gentleman Johnnie Marcone and Harry's first love, Elaine Mallory. From Booklist \*Starred \* This time, when Harry Dresden gets a call from Murphy, it's off the record, because she has been demoted, things in SI are politically shaky, and the police have already declared a suicide. Once Harry gets a good look, though, the suicide is clearly a murder with magical intent. As he investigates, hoping as always to stop the killer before more die, evidence points to the worst possible suspect: his half brother. In another complicated case, there are a lot of very powerful players, and with the war between the White Council and the Red Court vampires, politics are played hard and fast. In tracking down the killer, Harry manages to catch the attention of the White Court vampires again, too. On top of all that, he is still teaching strong-willed, occasionally impulsive teenager Molly Carpenter, and the teacher-student dynamic is difficult for him. And oh, yes, Lasciel, the demon trapped in a coin Harry has secured under his summoning circle, is a lingering presence. As usual in the Dresden Files, of which this is volume 9, Butcher puts the characters in a lot of danger, creates appalling moral choices for them, and spins an excellent noirish detective yarn in a well-crafted, supernaturally charged setting. The supporting cast is again fantastic, and Harry's wit continues to fly in the face of a peril-fraught plot. Regina
